The Nebraska Shrine Bowl is the longest running high school all-star football game in Nebraska. Since 1958, the game has helped support Shriners Hospitals for Children® and its mission to serve children in need of expert medical care. More than 1.4 million children have benefited from Shriners Hospitals' unique way of providing hope and healing, regardless of the families' ability to pay.

OVER 60 YEARS OF GREATNESS

An invitation to take part in the annual Nebraska Shrine Bowl is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for the best high school football all-stars in the state of Nebraska to showcase their talents. Many of Nebraska football's most recognized and decorated players, including Danny Woodhead, Eric Crouch, Scott Frost, Dean Steinkuhler, Dave Rimington, and Johnny Rodgers played for the Nebraska Shrine Bowl.

- More than 54 players from last year's game competed in collegiate athletics.
- Since the game's inception, 25 former players have received All-American honors, and 31 more have earned Academic All-American distinctions.
- In addition, Nebraska Shrine Bowl alumni have won 11 major college football awards including the Heisman, Lombardi, Outland, Walter Camp, O'Brien and Hill trophies.
- More than 50 former players have played on rosters in the National Football League.

ALL-STAR PLAYERS

Players are selected based on their demonstration of character and leadership both on and off the field. A consensus of the coaching staffs is taken into consideration during player selection. The general divide used to assign players to the North or South team is the Platte River. However, geographic exceptions are made to ensure that the best 90 players are selected for the game, regardless of the location of their school. Players must be high school seniors. All classes are considered.

CHAMPIONSHIP CALIBRE COACHES

Coaching staffs for the two teams are selected from among current Nebraska high school football head coaches. Nearing the conclusion of the regular season, the coaches for the North and South teams are nominated by a panel including Nebraska high school administrators, Nebraska Coaches Association members, and Nebraska sports journalists. Nominations are reviewed and selected by the Nebraska Shrine Bowl Football Committee. Once the head coaches are selected, each head coach selects 2 assistant coaches from among other Nebraska high school football coaches to complete their 6-person staff.

Coaches nominated must be active Nebraska high school football coaches who display extraordinary teaching and communications skills, and are recognized for their integrity and commitment to excellence in the coaching profession.

The year 2022 marks a special milestone for Shriners Hospitals for Children® — improving the lives of children and families for 100 years, since its first hospital opened in Shreveport, Louisiana, in 1922.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is a unique health care system with a reputation for finding answers and giving families hope. At our locations in the U.S., Canada and Mexico, children receive excellent care for orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries and cleft lip and palate. Since 1922, the health care system has improved the lives of more than 1.5 million children.

Children under the age of 18 are eligible for care from Shriners Hospitals for Children if there is a reasonable possibility they could benefit from the specialized services available. All services are provided regardless of the ability to pay or insurance status.

STATE-OF-THE-ART SPECIALTY CARE

The first Shriners Hospital was opened primarily to help children who had contracted polio. Today, the majority of our locations provide care for children with all types of orthopedic conditions. In the mid-1960s, we opened three hospitals specializing in pediatric burn care. We believe these are the only hospitals in the country that were initially established exclusively for the treatment of pediatric burns and related conditions. Burn care is now offered in Shriners Hospitals locations in Boston, Massachusetts; Dayton, Ohio; Galveston, Texas; and Sacramento, California. These hospitals continue to be pioneers in pediatric burn treatment and research and are recognized as leaders in the development of improved and innovative treatment techniques. In the early 1980s, our organization began the nation's first pediatric spinal cord injury rehabilitation programs. These initiatives offer patients a complete range of services that help promote recovery to the fullest extent possible. Shriners Hospitals for Children also offers care for cleft lip and palate. Despite the frequency of its occurrence and its severity, comprehensive care for patients with cleft lip and palate can be difficult to obtain. Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to improving care for children with this condition through a coordinated program of clinical excellence, teaching and research.

GROUNDBREAKING RESEARCH AND DISCOVERIES

Shriners Hospitals for Children strives to discover answers that will one day improve lives by conducting innovative research. The Shriners Hospitals for Children Genomics Institute is working to discover genetic causes for the conditions we treat and to develop new therapies. Our researchers have made significant breakthroughs, improving the care and quality of life for countless children worldwide, while adding to the global body of medical knowledge.

EDUCATING HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS

We are also proud of our role in medical education. By maintaining relationships with several medical teaching facilities, Shriners Hospitals for Children fosters an academic environment committed to providing superior education for medical professionals and quality care to all patients.

Since the first Shriners Hospital opened in 1922, the health care system has improved the lives of more than 1.5 million children by providing excellent pediatric specialty care. Today, Shriners Hospitals for Children® is a unique health care system with a reputation for finding answers and giving families hope. At our locations in the U.S., Canada and Mexico, children receive quality care for orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families' ability to pay or insurance status.

LEADING THE WAY IN ORTHOPEDICS

The first Shriners Hospital was opened primarily to help children who had contracted polio. Now, the majority of our Shriners Hospitals for Children locations are staffed and equipped to handle virtually all pediatric orthopedic problems, including sub-acute trauma.

We provide treatment for clubfoot; Legg-Calvé-Perthes disease and other hip disorders; hand disorders; limb deficiencies and discrepancies; scoliosis (curvature of the spine); osteogenesis imperfecta (brittle bone disease); juvenile idiopathic arthritis; and orthopedic difficulties related to cerebral palsy, spina bifida and other neuromuscular conditions.

Shriners Hospitals for Children offers a range of multidisciplinary services, including physical, occupational and recreational therapies, as well as orthotics and prosthetics. We also provide a wide variety of programs that focus on the overall needs and well-being of each patient.

PIONEERING BURN CARE AND RESEARCH

Shriners Hospitals for Children has been a leader in burn care, research and education since entering the burn care field in the mid-1960s. Thanks to the innovative medical care offered at our locations that provide burn care, every year countless children have a greater chance of surviving all types of burn injuries. Some of the advances made through our research efforts include improved survival rates, creation of pressure garments to minimize scarring, and development of engineered skin and better wound-healing techniques.

Shriners Hospitals provide critical, surgical and rehabilitative care for all degrees of burn injuries. Each state-of-the-art facility offering burn care provides

treatments for acute and sub-acute burns; healed burns; scarring that has caused contractures or limited mobility; smoke inhalation; facial scarring or deformities; and other skin conditions.

DELIVERING EXCELLENCE IN SPINAL CORD INJURY REHABILITATION

Shriners Hospitals for Children was the first health care system in the country to develop spinal cord injury rehabilitation programs specifically for children. We offer innovative therapies, emotional support, and training in independent living skills. In addition, we emphasize exercise and activity-based rehabilitation. These activities increase strength and stamina and enhance social interaction, confidence and independence.

PROVIDING EXPERTISE IN CLEFT LIP AND PALATE CARE

Cleft lip and palate occurs when the tissue that forms the upper lip and roof of the mouth fail to join together before birth.

At Shriners Hospitals for Children, patients with a cleft lip and/or palate are treated by a multidisciplinary team that works to improve the child's appearance and ability to eat, breathe and communicate. Each patient's unique treatment plan may include surgery, orthodontics, and hearing, speech and psychological therapies. Our goal is to help each child achieve optimal function, improve facial appearance to the fullest extent possible and build self-esteem.

SETH

Seth was 11 when his doctor noticed a curvature in his spine. They began with a “wait and see” approach, and later treatment from a chiropractor. Still, the curvature of his spine quickly progressed to a severe degree. He and his family learned about Shriners Children’s from a social media group focused on the Vertebral Body Tethering (VBT) treatment for scoliosis.

Seth, who is from Fort Wayne, Indiana, underwent VBT surgery at Shriners Children’s Philadelphia in 2017. The surgery, performed by Joshua Pahys, M.D., helped the young athlete quickly return to the playing field. “My pain has been reduced dramatically, my curvature is half what it used to be, and my flexibility is on par with my peers,” Seth said.

Seth, now 17, enjoys playing many sports, including football, baseball and basketball, and is now focusing on competitive golf. “VBT has given me the opportunity to perform my best in athletics without the limitations of scoliosis,” Seth said. “The extra inch I gained on the operating table didn’t hurt on the basketball court either.”

Seth is pleased and proud to have the opportunity to be a National Patient Ambassador for Shriners Children’s. “I was impressed by the amazing treatment that I received at Shriners Children’s, and I would be honored to guide someone to their care,” Seth said. “It means a lot to me to give back to the Shriners community because of the gift that they gave me.”

SYDNEY

Sydney, who is from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, learned she had scoliosis when she was 10. Her treatment began with bracing, but despite a strict exercise regimen and wearing her brace 23 hours a day for 1½ years, her curvature progressed. Searching for an alternative to spinal fusion surgery, Sydney and her family learned about the VBT treatment option.

Sydney had her VBT procedure at Shriners Children’s Philadelphia in 2018, performed by Steven W. Hwang, M.D. “VBT has allowed Sydney to retain her flexibility and to get back to all the things she loves faster and stronger than ever,” said her mother, Melissa.

Now 16, Sydney loves playing the oboe in the school band, and enjoys painting and swimming. Sydney, whose great-grandfather was a Shriner, enjoys continuing that family legacy by telling her story as a National Patient Ambassador.

“To make my scoliosis journey a more positive experience, I had to reach out and to help others,” Sydney said. “I said ‘yes’ to being a National Patient Ambassador because Shriners Children’s has done so much for me, and I feel I could never repay that. That surgery has changed my life. It has shaped me to be the person I am today.”

MIA

Mia, 17, was born with a severe case of infantile idiopathic scoliosis. Her journey with Shriners Children's began when she was 2, when she was first seen at the St. Louis location. Mia's treatments have included halo traction to gradually straighten and stretch her spine, as well as nearly 20 surgeries.

During her extensive time in the hospital, Mia and her care team developed a tight bond, and Mia considers the people she knows at Shriners Children's – her doctors, nurses, therapists, and even the security guard – family. She has served as a patient ambassador for Shriners Children's St Louis since she was 4 and has spoken to numerous audiences on behalf of the hospital. She has also appeared in promotional videos and media interviews. Mia's passion is theater and singing, and she was featured singing *I'll Be Home for Christmas* in our holiday commercials. Mia is also part of the Shriners Children's choir that performed in a recent recording of Foreigner's hit song *I Want to Know What Love Is*.

"I am so honored to be in this position," Mia said. "For as long as I can remember, I have always loved Shriners Hospitals. Not just because of the life it has given me, but the real love that comes from it. This community consists of the best people, and it truly makes my heart soar to know I'm a large part of it. It makes me proud to know that I am giving back to a hospital that not only gave me a normal life but is a second home for myself and my family."

CONNOR

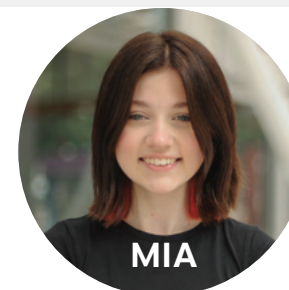
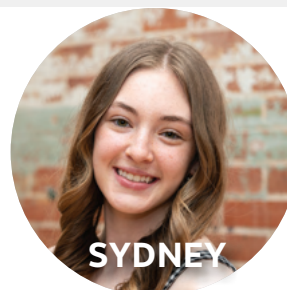
Connor, 15, was born with a bilateral incomplete cleft lip and complete cleft palate involving the hard and soft palate. As a newborn, his condition was so severe that he was even unable to create the suction needed to feed. By the time he was 3 weeks old, he was failing to gain weight and was about to be admitted to a hospital. That's when Connor's family learned about Shriners Children's Chicago.

There, his RN care coordinator gave his mother, Kelly, a special syringe, making it possible for her to finally feed her baby. And from that moment, Connor began an extensive treatment plan of surgeries and interventions that extends until he is 21, so that some repairs can be made after he has stopped growing.

Connor's condition affects not only his teeth and his ability to eat, but also his speech, hearing, and social and emotional well-being. In addition, Connor has a connective tissue disorder that eventually made it difficult for the active teen to participate in contact sports.

Still, Connor's can-do spirit and supportive family have helped him to find many ways to pursue his passions. Connor umpires for youth baseball, acts as a physical education mentor for other kids with disabilities at his school, and is an advocate and community volunteer. But most of all, Connor is a golfer. He maintains a busy training schedule and hopes to one day become a pro. And with his family, Connor is part of a large local annual fundraiser, a golf tournament that has over the years raised more than \$200,000 for Shriners Children's.

"I just want to use my time as a National Patient Ambassador to help other kids," Connor said. "I want kids to know that no matter what they look like, or how they walk, or what makes them different – that they shouldn't let anyone else make them feel bad. I want to help other kids feel good about themselves and their differences. I'm excited to make an impact on other Shriners kids' lives and spread awareness about our amazing hospitals and Shriners."

The Shriners International fraternity celebrates its 150th anniversary

In 1870, a group of Masons met regularly at a New York City restaurant, the Knickerbocker Cottage. They often discussed their desire for a fraternity for Masons, based on the fundamentals of Masonry but with the added elements of fun and fellowship. Walter M. Fleming, M.D., and actor William J. "Billy" Florence created what they called the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, adopting the popular Near-eastern theme and the distinctive red fez. While records show that the new fraternity held its first meeting in 1871, it was a meeting of Mecca Shriners in 1872 that is recognized as the fraternity's official founding.

Now known as Shriners International, the fraternity has nearly 200,000 members, and Shriners can be found on six continents. Shriners are known for their good humor, and they love spending time with others who share their interests, whether it be performing in parades or bands, connecting via Zoom for a technology unit or getting together to ride motorcycles, make barbecue or craft beer. Arabian-Nights theme that was popular at the time. Their iconic red fez, tall and brimless with a black tassel, is named after the town of its origin in Morocco.

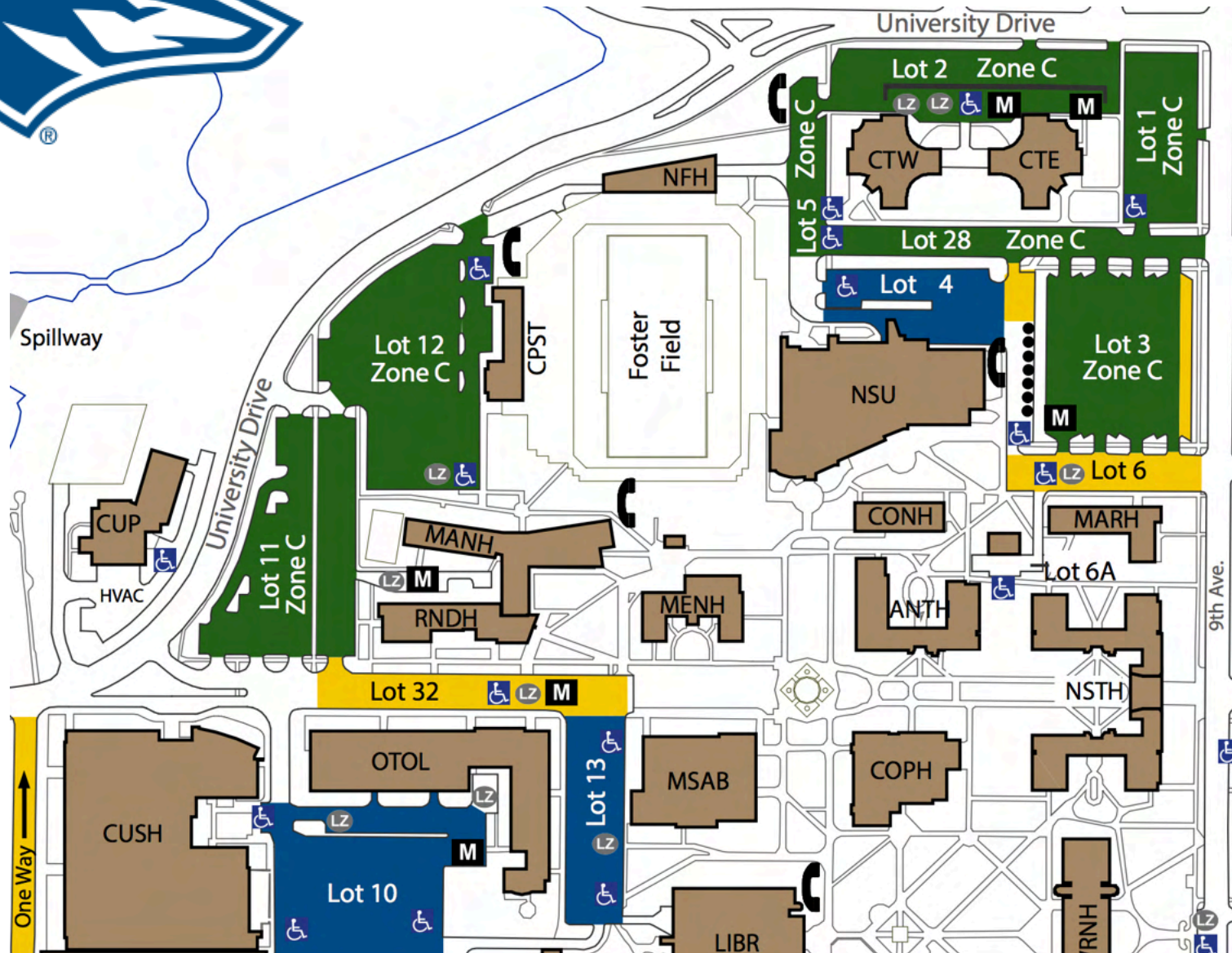
