The Doctors figured out that I had a cyst growing on my spine and it had intertwined with all the nerves. I have had many surgeries and will probably have a few more. The Shriners have given me everything I have needed to walk like leg braces, walkers, crutches, strollers, wheelchairs, therapy machine and a really cool bike. I'm now able to walk with arm crutches.

I'm so excited to be asked to be a Co-Captain for the 2025 Shriner Bowl. It is such an honor and I can't wait. I would like to Thank all the Amazing Shriner's that have done and continue to do so much for me.


TD STEIN ASSISTANT COACH






